a - The archaeological site of the Palace of Pella, where Alexander the Great was born, raised and came of age, was officially inaugurated, marking a milestone for cultural heritage in Central Macedonia. At the same time, two rare marble statues from the Hellenistic period were presented to the public for the first time at the Archaeological Museum of Pella.

b – The archaeological site of the Palace of Pella — the birthplace and childhood home of Alexander the Great — has officially opened to visitors, culminating decades of restoration efforts to showcase one of ancient Macedonia's grandest monuments.
