

## SWITZERLAND, GERMANY/AUSTRIA, FRANCE, CORSICA, SPAIN/PORTUGAL - Attachment G

### Corsica

i – Archaeologists from the French National Institute for Preventive Archaeological Research (INRAP) have uncovered a 1,900-year-old Roman tile production workshop on the east coast of Corsica, near the Étang de Diane lagoon.

### Spain

i - The Roman maritime Villa of Sant Gregori—an open, sunny area near a swampy zone (*palus*). Ancient writers Columella and Pliny noted that, in antiquity, the Pontine Marshes and the wetlands of Ravenna in Italy produced thriving vineyards thanks to drainage operations.

ii - In a discovery that intertwines archaeology, art history, and medicine, a 2nd-century AD bronze figurine unearthed in Bracara Augusta, now Braga in northern Portugal, may provide evidence of a rare genetic condition known as Crouzon syndrome.

### France

i – Reims. Luxurious statues and frescoes found domus dating to the second century during housing construction along the Rue de la Magdeleine.

ii – Vence. An Artist Noticed a Leak in His Studio. The Repairs Revealed a Mysterious Ancient Engraving Hidden Inside the Walls. When a contractor removed part of the wall's plaster, searching for water, he found an engraved stone: a Roman inscription dating to the first or second century C.E.

iii - Archaeologists in Pacé, Brittany, have uncovered a remarkable 1,800-year-old gold ring depicting Venus Victrix, the Roman goddess of victory.

iv - Archaeologists from the National Institute of Preventative Archaeological Research (INRAP) have uncovered three opulent bronze statuettes during excavations of a Roman domus complex in Reimes, France.
